


DIRECTIONS

Exit M14 at Exit #4 and take Barton Dr. south and east to Longshore Dr. Follow Longshore Dr. south along the river to the Argo Canoe Livery. X on the map. Or, from downtown, take Division St. or Detroit St. north to Broadway St. Follow Broadway St. northeast to Moore St. Take Moore St. northwest. Moore St. will become Longshore Dr. on the west side of Pontiac Tr. Continue west to the river.




Canoe Livery and picnic site

Commander's Message

First, be sure to check the Secretary's Comments about our squadron summer picnic.

One of the many strengths of our squadron is how members step forward when more help is needed. We have 13 students in the ABC program so P/C Art Pinsak volunteered to help grade the USPS and the Michigan DNR exams. This means that students will not have to wait for a grader, also can receive some comments on questions that they missed. Then both Art and Peter Hinman will be available as table proctors for the charting and plotting section. Art teaches advanced piloting and navigation, Peter is a mathematician so the students will have capable support.

We have survived the polar vortex! If anyone complains about the summer heat, ask them to scrub the bottom of your boat. Our P/C John Barr reported that their Upper Peninsula resort was still not accessible due to snow at the end of April. A recent article in the Detroit Free Press reported that the Great Lakes were still 26% ice covered at the end of April compared to 1% at the same time last year. Lake Superior was still 50% ice covered.

I described a night sail in Florida in the May Porthole. Our son called last week to describe another sail which was full of lessons. He reported that he was talking to a friend on his cell phone, missed a green buoy marking a channel and ran aground. Lesson #1 is whether the helmsman can afford to be on the cell phone in narrow channels. He used his Danforth to kedge off which is a good procedure but then could not retrieve the anchor. A passing powerboater offered to help. The result was that the rode promptly fouled the propeller of the powerboat. Lesson #2 is that lines in the water deserve respect. He then dove under the power boat to cut the fouled rode. I threw a fit! Lesson #3 is that the engine must be stopped and the transmission in reverse to absolutely avoid any chance of a propeller strike. This can be fatal if an artery is cut. Our 10 year old grandson had it right! When all this was unfolding, he went below and put his life jacket on. Good man!



Secretary's Message Lt/C Jeannine Buchanan



A visit to the recently opened National Museum of the Great Lakes at Toledo can be a delightful summer day trip. The museum traces the history of the Great Lakes from the earliest explorers to Great Lakes shipping today. The exhibit labels provide detailed explanations, require about an hour of study. The freighter Col. James M. Schoonmaker which sailed the lakes from 1911 to 1981 has been restored and is adjacent to the museum, available for self-guided tours. The staterooms for passengers and the captain are absolutely elegant but the bridge had only radar and a direction finder, none of the electronics that we use today. You can prowl the depths of the engine room which contains the steam turbines.

I have a few suggestions to create a wonderful day. First, select good weather because much of the Schoonmaker tour is outside. Then visit the website to check on times and costs which are quite reasonable. Consider taking a picnic lunch; although tables are not yet available, the grounds have an abundance of benches. Parking is abundant but direction signs are minimal so either prepare a map from Mapquest or use your GPS, smart phone, etc. The address is 1701 Front Street, Toledo.

We spent about 20 minutes talking to one of the volunteer docents who was the second mate on the Schoonmaker until it was taken out of service. On November 10, 1975 he was on the bridge northbound just above Detour when he heard to the Arthur M. Anderson report that they had lost visual contact with the Edmund Fitzgerald.







D9 Bristol Bay Education Cruise

Sign up for a 3-hour United States Coast Guard (USCG), United States Power Squadron (USPS) and United States Coast Guard Auxiliary (USCGAUX) D/9 educational opportunity aboard the 140-ft. Coast Guard Cutter "BRISTOL BAY." The Bristol Bay will also be pushing their Aids to Navigation (floating buoys, fixed aids and ranges) barge. The barge is capable of carrying approximately 250 people. Bring binoculars if you have them, and dress warmly.

The U S Power Squadron, the U S Coast Guard and US Coast Guard Auxiliary are the world's premier marine safety organizations that take great pride in sponsoring this educational opportunity to recreational basic boating students. This will be a unique 3-hour educational opportunity aboard the 140-ft ship and its 130-ft. barge for a total of a 270 foot vessel.

We will be traveling the waters of the Detroit River and Lake St. Clair. We hope this event will provide the basic boating students with a better understanding of the aids to navigation and their light characteristics. An understanding of the aids to navigation is an essential part of safe boating, although covered in the classroom during your course; it is best understood by actually seeing the aids at sea. The timing has been planned so that daytime and evening light characteristics of the aids can be seen. During the entire voyage, a Power Squadron or Coast Guard Auxiliary member and an active duty Coast Guard Officer will provide commentary. You will see and hear about Aids to Navigation and more during our river and lake cruise. You'll have fun and improve your boating safety.

Each Power Squadron and Coast Guard Auxiliary student will be given a chart replica of the river and lake areas we are going to cruise, showing the various navigational aids and their individual characteristics. They will be numbered on the chart and the actual aids and their light characteristics will be identified as we pass them.

We will begin boarding promptly at 7.00 PM at Coast Guard Station Group Detroit. This is at the foot of Mt. Elliott Avenue, right at the Detroit River. We will have personnel there to assist and direct you on parking and boarding procedures. A detailed map of the area will be mailed to you along with your boarding passes. Departure time is 7:30 P M.

CHILDREN: Children who attend the USPS or the USCGAUX Public Boating Courses are welcome to participate in this educational opportunity. However, we must restrict participation by other family members (and friends) to those 12 years of age and older. The Power Squadron and the Coast Guard Auxiliary are family oriented organizations and we sponsor many activities that include children. But, because this cruise requires the concentration of the participants, we have the age restriction. Thanks for understanding.

ABOUT USPS: Formed in 1914, the United States Power Squadrons is the world's largest nonprofit boating organization. Their 60,000 members in the 450 squadrons are boating families who contribute to their communities by promoting safe boating on the water and in the classroom.

All USPS members are volunteers. USPS District 9 is composed of 2,003 members in 22 squadrons. Collectively, these 22 squadrons teach the USPS ABC3 Boating Course to residents of the Lower Peninsula of Michigan and Northern Indiana.

ABOUT USCGAUX: The Coast Guard Auxiliary was created by an Act Of Congress in 1939, as a non- military, civilian affiliate of the Coast Guard, and as such plays a substantial role In the National Safe Boating program. The total Coast Guard Auxiliary family consists of 35,000 volunteers. The District 9 Central region is composed of 10 Divisions, with 56 Flotillas and about 1 500 members.

All of our basic boating students are being invited to join this event and because of this, we urge you to get your reservations in early. Fill out the form today and mail it along with your check. We are limited to 250 passengers and expect to fill up fast. First come, first served. If you are among those who enroll too late, your check will be refunded.
